Our concern should be the price so I will ask for a discount.

We should not have plants which are sensitive to excessive touching and kids will always want to play with the plants. What's more, I can see some of the kids pulling the leaves out and sticking them inside their mouths. That would kill the entrance plants. So if we are going to have entrance plants, just make sure they are safe!

The entrance is a perfect place for plants because there is a lot of sunlight but it only hits the left side which is also windy and cold in the winter. A mix of different plants on each side would be ideal for all the residents.

Name of Plant	Type of Plant	Care, Water and Sunlight Requirements	Special Notes
English Ivy	Climbing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> This plant is quite easy to care for. You should water it regularly and keep the soil moist especially when it is kept outdoors. It needs direct sunlight. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It needs to be protected from wind. Its leaves and sap are poisonous.
Chinese Virginia Creeper	Climbing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is an all-around tough plant that is easy to care for. You should water it regularly. It survives in low light conditions but grows faster in direct sunlight. It tolerates cold, exposed locations and heavy clay soils. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Its leaves are colourful in summer with pink and white veins.
Moon Orchid	Small Flowering	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It requires expert care. It needs loosely packed soil that allows airflow around its roots. The soil needs to be kept wet in order to flower. Do not expose it to direct sunlight. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It needs regular fertiliser. It has pink or white flowers.
Dumb Cane	Small	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is easy to care for. It should be watered frequently in summer and kept moist in winter. Keep it in well-lit areas. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The leaves and sap are poisonous. Avoid pollutants. Cold temperatures can kill this plant. It is an ideal house plant.
Kumquat	Small Flowering Fruit	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> This plant requires a lot of care. It should be watered frequently but not overwatered. It needs direct sunlight. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is a beautiful decorative plant and has white flowers. It can easily be damaged by insects and excess touching. It needs fertiliser 4 times a year.
Red Crown Cactus	Small Flowering	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> This plant is easy to care for. It does not require much water. It needs direct sunlight, but balanced with shade at night. Avoid cold conditions. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It has sharp spikes which can cause injuries. It has red or orange flowers.
